IMPACT –

The physical activity levels across the school have risen compared to the two previous covid-impacted academic years. Every class has had at least the recommended 2 hours of curriculum PE lessons every week; this is including Gymnastics and Dance units for all of KS1 and KS2. All of Years 5 and 6 have had a weekly swimming lesson for a term each together with some reluctant swimmers in Year 6 having additional opportunities to swim. This has also created a new link with a different host school that we will try to make further use of next year too. Lunchtimes have vastly changed to create an enjoyable experience with a variety of activity options, work will continue on this next year too. This has also seen the return of 'young leaders' from Year 6 helping to run and control activities. A variety of teacher-run clubs have been hosted too focusing on different year groups and a wide range of sports. A targeted Yoga club was also launched and received positive feedback from parents.

IMPACT –

A variety of new equipment has been bought and implemented for both curriculum PE such as the football goals as well as plenty of playtime equipment. There has been a buzz around school and excitement created in preparation for the newly redecorated and refurbished hall which should be completed ready for the 22-23 academic year, this will also make the space more functional and appealing during indoor PE lessons. The adventure playground was fully refurbished and all classes have been scheduled a weekly slot to enjoy this facility. Every sports event has been attended by children wearing uniformed clothing with the school badge freshly embroidered on, giving a more professional appearance as well as extra pride in representing Potley Hill.

IMPACT –

Teachers have been allowed time to settle back into teaching PE. Emails were sent by RF with prompts and tips to improve teaching PE with emphasis on engagement, differentiation and lesson structure. A few staff attended an SGO run Netball CPD session in order to understand the slight change in rules. RF attended the Hampshire PE conference and is beginning to use some of the ideas gained. During recent lesson observations RF could see a clear improvement in lesson structure and a clear focus on having as many children active and engaged at all points of the lesson. Clear modelling and explanations were an improvement too from staff CPD.

IMPACT –

All Year 6 children undertook Bikeability sessions at the start of the year in order to gain further cycling proficiency – this was a success and really enjoyed by pupils. New teacher-run clubs like Hockey, Multi-sports and Football for LKS2 were incredibly popular with most of KS2 taking part in a club for at least one half term. High demand for clubs so more will be provided going forward both internal and external. A range of SGO organised events were also attended for a range of different sports with a range of different children involved. The school achieved the Silver school games mark again which shows how active we have been.

IMPACT –
 Once again, we entered the school football league for both boys and girls, finishing 2nd place in both and reaching the quarter final of the cup with the boys' team. RF organised a number of intra-house competitions throughout the year, using a variety of alternative sports to provide different opportunities – these were enjoyed by the children and the team point system increased to competitive edge of these events. We had our first real sports day post covid which involved a carousel of activities and races. Sports Leaders from Frogmore Community College helped run these activities, another link that we would like to continue and strengthen going forwards.
